January-June Accomplishments



- **Individuals Assisted:** 1,529 served via service requests, presentations, community events and meetings
- **Services Provided:** 1,370
- **Items Distributed:** 4,490 (Estimated value \$8,463)
- **Volunteer Hours Contributed:** 1,779 (Estimated value \$29,355)
- **Total translation/interpretation hours 2025:** Nearly 300 hours, community events (Estimated value \$7,500)

Events Highlights

- **Mountain Hope Clinic Health Fair (Jan 30–31):** 75 patients.
- **Emergency Preparedness Clinics** (Served 276 people):
- **Child Abuse Awareness Event (Apr 4 – Wears Farm City Park):** Engaged with 86 individuals
- **2 Vision Clinics with Sevier County Lions Club:** **Apr 30** Provided 8 volunteers and translators to serve 54 patients & **July 30** Provided 12 interpreters with 69 volunteer hours. Served 73 patients for glasses, 14 for readers and 6 vision applications.
- **Health Fair with Sevier County Health Dept (May 6):** Co-sponsored health fair with Sevier County Health Department and deployed 36 volunteers & translators; served 67 families.
- **St. Mary's Legacy Clinic (Monthly):** Ongoing translation support for an average of 32 patients/month, nearly 300 hours
- **Dept. of Children's Services (DCS) Support (10 hrs. Monthly)**
- **Children's Health Assistance (Monthly):** 4 cases monthly, 3 at SCHD, and 1 at McNabb Center
